

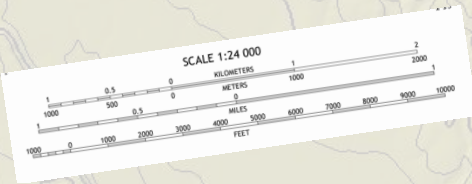
Map and Geographic Information Sources for Collaboration
